



DriveNow starts free airport transfer service

Budapest joined twelve European cities where the airport can be reached using DriveNow' premium service

From July, DriveNow offers its Drive'n Fly service for customers to pick up or drop off a car at Budapest Airport. This way Budapest is joining 12 major European cities where the airport can be reached using DriveNow's car sharing service. The transfer does not involve any extra costs and it covers all the way to the entrance of the terminals. With a fleet of 240 cars including larger BMW models, the service allows users to conveniently reach the airport with larger baggage and in bigger groups.

Budapest, 1st of July, 2019 - DriveNow has launched its transfer service that connects the city of Budapest and Liszt Ferenc International Airport. Thereby, Budapest is joining 12 other major European cities - such as Lisbon, Milan, London or Berlin - where the airport can be reached conveniently using the premium car sharing service. In Budapest, the transfer service does not include any extra costs in addition to the normal rental fee of the cars.

DriveNow has established its car parking area in Vecsés. After parking the car and ending the rental there, users are transported directly to the entry level of Liszt Ferenc International Airport by a free shuttle bus service.

Passengers arriving back at Budapest airport can simply call the minibus shuttle service to the terminal (+36 70 374 6141) that will shortly arrive to the Departure level. The shuttle then takes back the DriveNow customer to the DriveNow car parking area in Vecsés, where they can get in a DriveNow car and head straight to the city.

A diverse DriveNow fleet of 240 cars including bigger models like the BMW X1, X2, or 2 Active Tourer allows users to conveniently reach the airport with family, friends, or with a lot of luggage. The airport connections open the possibility of end-to-end journeys; customers can now drive to Budapest airport, catch their flight and jump in another shared car upon landing in one of the European DriveNow cities.

DriveNow launched its car sharing service in Budapest in April. New users can simply download the app, register their details and find the nearest DriveNow car. For one month after the launch of the new airport transfer service, until the end of July, DriveNow gives 50 bonus minutes instead of the usual 25, rewarding new registrations.

DriveNow is a European free-floating car sharing service, operated with premium BMW and MINI models and mixed fleets of both combustion and electric cars. DriveNow used to be a BMW Group subsidiary company. In February 2019, BMW Group's DriveNow and Daimler AG's car2go were combined to one joint venture named SHARE NOW.

About SHARE NOW

Rent a car anywhere and anytime – that's SHARE NOW. As the market leader and pioneer of free-floating carsharing, SHARE NOW has over four million members and is represented in 30 major cities globally with over 20,000 vehicles, of which 3,200 are electrically powered. From registration through the rental process, all steps are performed digitally via a smartphone app. SHARE NOW provides a sustainable solution for urban mobility and, as part of a range of mobility options, contributes significantly to reducing vehicular congestion in cities: Each SHARE NOW vehicle replaces up to eight privately-owned cars in urban traffic, and at the same time is used up to six times more frequently. SHARE NOW is the largest provider of electromobile free-floating carshare in the world with four European cities operating with 100 percent fully electric fleets and 13 additional cities operating with partial electric fleets. Today, SHARE NOW is present in Europe and North America with BMW, Mercedes-Benz, MINI and smart vehicles and continues to expand its market leadership in free-floating carsharing. SHARE NOW is one of five mobility services under the joint venture of the BMW Group and the Daimler AG, founded in 2019. The company is headquartered in the German capital Berlin.
